Basic Pumps – 16 Hours

This class serves as an introductory to basic pumps in the fire service. In class, students will be exposed to nursing operations, drafting operations, hydrant operations and relay pumping. This hand-on class will enable students to charge 1 or 2 lines and maintain a water supply. Student will need Full Turnout gear.

Chief 101 - 8 Hours

This certification-related course is designed to apprise chief officers of the various aspects and complexities surrounding the operations and organization of North Carolina Fire departments. Emphasis will be placed on ratings and inspections, NFIRS reporting, prevention and relief funds, grant programs, basic line of duty death information, various state associations, and an overview of chief officer expectations in North Carolina. This class will satisfy the 9S insurance inspection criteria as specified by the North Carolina Administrative Code.

Emergency Vehicle Driver – 20 Hours

This course deals with the safe operation of emergency vehicles, driving skills, legal implications of emergency driving. departmental standard operating procedures, and abilities to satisfy the key requirements of NFPA 1002: Standard for Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator Professional Qualifications (2017 edition).

Engine Company Operations - Nozzle & Couplings - 16 Hours

These courses have become our foundation. Lately there are so many arguments on modern fire behavior and extinguishment tactics, and less on the importance of the fundamentals of engine company skill sets. Identifying this as a problem we have dissected and placed extreme focus on each portion of engine company operations: the pack (load out), the stretch, the push, and the water. Increasing your proficiency on these items will allow you to improve decision making when encountering diverse challenges of the fireground.

No matter your rank or level of experience our focus is to take your skills to the next level. We focus on strengthening your foundation while increasing your ability to get water on the fire fast. Thus, developing you into a GAME CHANGER!!

Our Engine Company programs are broken down into a multitude of different sessions and each of them are their own program, but can be tailored to your needs. We offer 4hrs, 8hr, and 16hr programs with major focuses on:

- The Big Three
 The Pack (the hose load)
 The Stretch
 The Push (nozzle work)
- The Oops!
- The Big Line
- The Art of the Leader Line
- Standpipe Operations
- Judging the stretch
- Stairwell stretches
- Line over Ladder

Explosives, Bombings & Terrorism – 12 Hours

This class takes Emergency First Responders (EMS, Fire, Law Enforcement and Rescue) through a basic understanding of explosives, the latest Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) being employed overseas and domestically, how they are being constructed, and used by terrorists against first responders and the public. What first responders need to do to ensure their safety against this threat and how to integrate with bomb squads at the scene of a bombing or other terrorist events. This course will take the students through basic bomb and explosive understanding, bomb threats, search techniques and basic safety at bomb/terrorist scenes all of which they may encounter in their jobs. It will also discuss terrorist methods, activities and the latest cases. We will discuss ways we can help stop or prevent future terrorist events in the U.S.

This course will be presented through classroom instruction, and practical exercises including, indoor and outdoor IED searching, active shooter problems and live improvised explosive demonstrations.

Flashover Simulator - 12 Hours

The student will learn to understand the phenomenon of flashover, recognize the warning signs, learn nozzle techniques to delay fire development and progress; and ventilation's effect on interior room conditions. Training will consist of classroom session and use of the Live Fire Flashover Trailer. Students will need full Turnout gear and SCBA with spare bottle.

Law and Administration - 16 Hours

The code enforcement Law and Administration course is an overview of NC's building regulation system and is designed for the education and training of building, electrical, mechanical, plumbing and fire prevention code enforcement officials. Topics include the structure of federal, state and local governments, the history of the NC State Building Code, relevant General Statutes, and the enforcement responsibilities of local inspection departments. Course standards are set by the Code Officials Qualification Board and administered by the Engineering and Codes Division of the NC Department of Insurance/Office of State Fire Marshal. Successful completion of this course along with others specified by the Qualification Board qualifies participants to take state inspector certification exams. Students will need the 2018 Laws and Administration Book.

LP Gas - 16 Hours

This 16-hour course is designed to educate the firefighter on various characteristics of gases and its behavior. Study will include definitions, flashpoints, product dangers; emergency shut-off valves, and safety devices, as well as other critical information necessary for the firefighter. This class includes Live Exterior Fire Training. All students must have met all NFPA Live Burn Standards 1403 as require by the North Carolina Fire Commission. Students will need Full Turnout Gear, SCBA and Spare Bottle.

National Fire Academy Incident Safety Officer - 16 hours

This class is designed to provide First Responders with the ability to identify and analyze safety concerns as they relate to all hazard scene evaluations and communicate recommended solutions to the command authority. This class examines the safety officer's role at emergency response situations. A specific focus on operations within an incident command system as a safety officer is a main theme.

The Good News or The Bad News - Lithium-Ion Battery Response - 8 Hours

Lithium-Ion Batteries are everywhere! Does your department have established response guidelines or best practices when dealing with these Lithium Battery Emergencies? We will dive into different types of lithium-ion batteries including how and where they are used. This will include discussions on hybrid vehicles, EV vehicles, and lithium-ion batteries and their uses in several aspects. This class will assist your department in the battery fire response mindset, assisting you with developing best response practices for your organization. It is not a matter of will your department will have a response, it is a matter of when.

Technical Rescue Rope Rescue Awareness - 9 Hours

This certification-related course in rope rescue (awareness level) will present the Technical Rescuer (TR) with an introduction to rope rescue, size-up, hazards associated with rope rescue, supporting the operations, initiating a response, and technician level rescue incident. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines.


