

Readiness and Employment Veteran (VR&E, Voc Rehab or Chapter 31)













The #1 question about Voc Rehab is... What is Veteran Readiness and Employment?

A program designed to assist veterans/service members with service-connected disabilities to become suitably employed, maintain employment or achieve independence in daily living.





Eligibility Criteria

Veterans:

- Honorable or other than dishonorable discharge
- A final VA service-connected disability rating of 10 percent or more; or a memorandum rating of 10 percent
- Apply for Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Services

Active Duty Servicemembers:

- Expect to receive an honorable discharge
- Apply for Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment services
- Obtain a VA memorandum rating of 20 percent or more; or obtain a proposed Integrated Disability Evaluation Service (IDES) rating



What is an Employment Handicap?

- An impairment of the individual's ability to prepare for, obtain or retain employment consistent with his/her abilities, aptitudes, and interests. The impairment cannot or has not been overcome with sustainable suitable employment.
- Serious employment handicap needed to establish entitlement for Veterans rated 10%
- Serious Employment handicap would be a more significant impairment which can include:
 Severity or number of disabling conditions
 - Unstable work history
 - Long periods of unemployment
 - Reliance on government support programs
 - History of substance abuse
 - Frequent hospitalizations
 - Chronic pain
 - Withdrawal from society
 - Criminal record
 - Financial difficulty

The 5 Support-and-Services

Reemployment Track

 Assist in your return to your former job and support your employer in meeting your needs.

Rapid Access to Employment Track

 If you want to find a job or career that uses your existing skill set, the Rapid Access to Employment Track can help you with your job search.

Self-Employment Track

 If you're a service member or Veteran with a service-connected disability and employment barrier, the Self-Employment track can help you start your own business if you have a viable business plan, where-as your products will be purchased within six months to one year.

Employment Through Long-Term Services Track

 If you have a service-connected disability of 10% or more, and an employment barrier, they can help you get the education or training you need to find work in a different field that won't aggravate your service-connected disabilities.

Independent Living Track

 If you can't return to work right away, you may qualify for services that can help you live as independently as possible.



Re-employment Track

For individuals separating from active duty, National Guard, or Reserves

Services focused on returning to previous employers

Services may also include:

Rapid Access to Employment

For individuals seeking employment:

Soon after separation

Who already have the necessary skills to be competitive in the job market

Employment Adjustment Services

Personalized Case Management Services





Employment Through Long-Term Services

For individuals needing specialized training and/or education to obtain and maintain suitable employment

Services may include:

Apprenticeships and Internships

On-the-Job Training (OJT)

Higher Education or Vocational Training

Tuition/Fees/Books/Tools/Supplies

Tutoring

Subsistence Allowance

Personalized Case Management Support





Self-Employment

- For individuals who because of their disabilities:
 - Have limited access to traditional employment,
 - Need flexible work schedules, or
 - A more accommodating work environment
- Services may also include:
 - Analysis of the viability of the business concept
 - Assistance with the development of a business plan
 - Training in small business operations
 - Guidance on obtaining resources
 - Personalized Case Management Support



Independent Living

- For individuals who are not able to work at the current time and need rehabilitation services to live more independently
- Services may also include:
 - Comprehensive In-Home Assessment
 - Assistive Technologies
 - Independent Living Skills Training
 - Connection to Community-Based Support Services
 - Personalized Case Management Services
 - Coordination With VA's Specially Adapted Housing Program and/or VA's Home Improvement Structure Assistance Program
 - Personalized Case Management Support



Veteran Readiness & Employment

- 48 Months
- 100% of Tuition
- Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) (if qualified) or VA Monthly Stipend
- 100% of Required Books
- Required Supplies
- Adaptive Equipment as Needed
- Required Equipment, Tools, and Software for Courses
- Tutors (if necessary)
- Counselor Assigned to Work with Veterans Throughout Process
- Employment Program Assistance While in School as well as After Completing Education/Training for Employment



Basic Benefit Information

- Maximum of 48 Months of Entitlement
- May Utilize Within 12 Years from Date of Initial VA Disability Rating Notification
- Exception for Veterans With a Serious Employment Handicap





How to Apply for VR&E

- If Still on Active Duty and Not In IDES, a Memorandum Rating Request (VA Form 28-0588) Must be Submitted
- If a Veteran or Currently in IDES, Submit VA Form 28-1900
- Apply Online at http://vabenefits.vba.va.gov/vonapp/main.asp
